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How it Works:

1. Pick up a BINGO Card at any desk (Circulation, Reference, or Children's), or print a card at home.
2. Complete the activities in the squares to get BINGO! Activities fit into 5 categories: Read, Visit the Library, Explore, Try, & Community! Which ones will you do to get Bingo?
3. Bring your card to the library **between January 16 and February 24** to receive your prize(s). You can come back with your card for different prize levels, or get all of them at once.

Prize levels:

- Single Horizontal, Vertical, Diagonal, or Four Corners BINGO - coupon for a Free Book from the ongoing Friends of the Library Book Sale.
- Double BINGO - 1 raffle ticket for a gift card to a local business.
- Full Card - 2nd Free Book Coupon and 2nd raffle ticket

TRY:

... **a new recipe or food:** Looking for ideas or recipes? Cookbooks can be found at the 641.5s in any nonfiction section (Juvenile, Young Adult, Graphic Novel, and Adult)!

... **a new skill or hobby:** This does not mean do it perfectly - it just means give it a shot!

... **a library resource:** Visit <https://www.maynardpubliclibrary.org/e-resources> for a full list of our databases - there are resources for all ages, including three levels Encyclopedia Britannica - Fundamentals for Preschool through grade 5, School for upper elementary students through high school, and Library for your traditional encyclopedia experience. There's the Chilton Auto Library (useful for trying a new skill!), language learning, and more. For physical resources outside of the traditional books and movies, check out our Library of Things at <https://www.maynardpubliclibrary.org/libraryofthings>

... **writing a poem:** There is no wrong way to write a poem, but if you are looking for a place to get started, check out the 808.1s in Juvenile or Adult nonfiction.
